Final WaterCAP Workshop:
Regional Solutions to Climate Change Adaption
in Water Management

29th January 2013, from 9.30 – 15.30 h in Brussels

This workshop hosted European and regional (water) policy makers' discussion of examples from the North Sea region on climate change adaptation. The aim was to make the expertise from the WaterCAP projects available and by this inspire our participants to transfer our innovative tools and approaches to deal with their own water management challenges. The workshop highlighted the benefits from European wide exchange of regional experience - and provided a look-out on how the exchange could be encouraged in future.

WaterCAP builds on the outcomes of six Interreg projects: Aquarius, CLIMAT, CFA, C2C Islands, DIPol, SAWA and SaltICA. Combining specific success stories of the projects, we presented the regional approaches on integration from three different perspectives:

- Addressing specific issues of water quantity management (floods, scarcity) and quality (salt intrusion, nutrients management)
- Presenting tools and methods that help to generate and process the necessary data and information
- Learning from successful processes allowing the integration and support of all relevant stakeholders
