Implementing sustainable management for surface water and groundwater resources needs broad support from stakeholder groups including citizens. The <u>WaterCoG project</u> implemented a number of pilots which analysed first the governance baseline, before developing tailor-made co-governance approaches using (online) tools for stakeholder involvement.

A central challenge in co-governance has been to integrate and to monitor a vast amount of data. Stakeholders acknowledge the need for information and expert knowledge.

#### **Aim of Online Workshop**

In this workshop we would like to share our experience on using tools in stakeholder involvement and learn also from other projects in the North Sea programme. Some are already included in the agenda (see next page) - if you are interested in sharing your tool, please let us know.
